In addition, teachers are expected to adapt to ongoing developments, including the use of technology as a supporting tool for learning. This adaptability demonstrates teachers' readiness to face educational challenges in the modern era.

Thus, teacher professionalism can be understood as the totality of teachers' attitudes, abilities, and responsibilities in carrying out their professional duties optimally, ethically, and with a clear orientation toward improving educational quality. Teacher professionalism is a vital factor in creating effective and meaningful learning processes and contributes significantly to the comprehensive achievement of educational goals.

### ***Characteristics of Professional Teachers***

There are three main characteristics of professional teachers that should be possessed by educators in Indonesia.

1. Professional teachers can be understood as educators who have comprehensive mastery of teaching competencies and instructional skills and are able to apply them effectively in accordance with students' needs. In the era of rapid technological and information development, teachers are required to implement 21st-century learning that prepares students to become individuals who are critical thinkers, creative, innovative, able to communicate effectively, and capable of collaboration. These objectives cannot be achieved if teachers stop learning and are unwilling to continuously improve their professional quality.
2. Professional teachers must be able to build collegial relationships. Through collaboration and knowledge sharing with fellow teachers, educators can continue to learn, develop their competencies, and adapt to ongoing educational changes. Participation in professional communities enables teachers to strengthen their professional roles while fostering a sense of togetherness, mutual support, and shared responsibility among colleagues.
3. Professional teachers are required to maintain strong social awareness. Indonesian teachers are often regarded as educational figures who carry out a noble mission driven by a sense of dedication and commitment. Despite facing various challenges, teachers remain at the forefront of efforts to educate the nation and improve the overall quality of education.

### ***Ethical Behavior in Schools***

According to Mukhlisah (2021), etymologically, the term *ethics* originates from the Greek word *ethos*, which refers to habits or values that serve as guidelines for individual behavior in social life. In the *Kamus Besar Bahasa Indonesia* (KBBI, 2008), ethics is defined as a field of study that examines goodness and badness in relation to moral rights and obligations. In line with the study conducted by Ruslan (2016), ethical development is closely connected to the field of philosophy. Thus, human reasoning becomes a primary reference for determining what is considered good or bad in ethical terms.

The term *ethics* can be explained through three different concepts as proposed by Bertens (2011). First, ethics is understood as a system of values, meaning that it functions as moral norms and values used by individuals or groups as guidelines for regulating behavior. Second, ethics refers to a set of moral principles or values embodied in a code of ethics. Third, ethics is defined as a scientific discipline that studies goodness and badness. Ethics is regarded as a science when ethical possibilities—namely principles and values related to what is considered good or bad—are no longer accepted uncritically by society but instead become subjects of systematic and methodological reflection through research. As a scientific discipline, ethics can contribute to the formulation of professional codes of ethics.

Fundamentally, ethics is related to the existence of norms that are closely associated with morality and cannot be separated from the surrounding culture. However, there are clear distinctions between ethics, morality, *akhlak*, and *adab* as guiding principles in determining what is right and wrong. Teachers' ethical behavior serves as an essential foundation for maintaining students' trust and creating a conducive learning environment within schools (Rahmawati, 2021).

### ***The Relationship between Teacher Professionalism and Ethical Behavior***

Teacher professionalism and ethical behavior are two inseparable aspects, as professional competence must be guided by ethical values to ensure that its

implementation remains within moral and educational boundaries. A teacher is considered professional not merely because of academic qualifications or mastery of subject matter, but also because of the ability to perform professional duties with responsibility, integrity, and moral awareness. Professionalism without ethics is reduced to technical skills devoid of meaning, as teaching fundamentally involves human values and character formation. Therefore, to become a true educator, teachers must integrate instructional competence with sound moral attitudes.

Teachers' ethical behavior serves as the moral foundation that directs the use of all professional competencies. Teachers may possess strong classroom management skills, deep understanding of child development psychology, and mastery of modern instructional strategies; however, these abilities must be accompanied by fairness, empathy, respect for students' rights, and the ability to maintain students' personal confidentiality. In this sense, ethics functions as a filter that ensures teachers' competencies are applied to protect and develop students' potential rather than to cause harm.

Furthermore, teacher professionalism is regulated and reinforced through professional codes of ethics. These codes are established by professional organizations, such as the Indonesian Teachers Association (PGRI), and contain behavioral guidelines that bind teachers in carrying out their professional duties. Through adherence to codes of ethics, teachers are provided with clear guidance on how to interact with students, fellow educators, school leaders, parents, and the wider community. Codes of ethics function not only as behavioral boundaries but also as mechanisms for maintaining professional integrity and safeguarding the dignity of the teaching profession. Teachers who comply with professional codes of ethics demonstrate the full realization of professionalism.

Teacher professionalism is also reflected in daily practices, not only during the delivery of instructional content. Punctuality, the use of respectful language, the ability to establish positive communication with students, and honesty in conducting assessments represent tangible expressions of the integration between professionalism and ethics. Professional teachers consistently serve as positive role models both inside and outside the classroom. Even teachers' behavior outside the school environment can influence public perceptions of schools and the teaching profession, as teachers are widely regarded as moral figures in society.

The relationship between professionalism and ethical behavior is also evident in the function of education as a process of character development. Teachers are responsible not only for teaching academic knowledge but also for instilling life values such as honesty, discipline, responsibility, care, and tolerance. These values cannot be effectively transmitted to students if teachers themselves do not practice them in their daily actions. From a social perspective, professional ethics help teachers build public trust in educational institutions. Conversely, ethical violations by teachers can damage the reputation of schools and reduce public confidence, even when teachers possess strong academic capabilities.

Thus, it can be affirmed that teacher professionalism and ethical behavior are not separate concepts but an integrated unity that must operate in harmony. Professional competence equips teachers with the ability to teach effectively, while professional ethics provide moral direction to ensure that these abilities are applied appropriately. This study has several limitations that should be acknowledged. First, the research relied solely on a literature review method, which limited the findings to existing theories and previous research without incorporating empirical data from field observations or direct interactions with teachers and students. Second, the scope of the literature reviewed may not comprehensively represent all perspectives on teacher professionalism and ethical behavior, particularly those arising from diverse educational contexts and levels.

Based on these limitations, future research is recommended to employ empirical approaches, such as qualitative field studies, surveys, or mixed-methods research, to gain deeper insights into the implementation of teacher professionalism and ethical behavior in real school settings. Further studies may also explore the relationship between teacher professionalism, ethical conduct, and student learning outcomes across different educational levels and cultural contexts. Such research would contribute to a more comprehensive understanding of how professionalism and ethics can be effectively strengthened in the teaching profession.
